Vaccines For Kids

Children as young as 6 months old
can now be vaccinated for COVID-19.



We are thrilled that children as young as 6 months old are now eligible to get vaccinated against COVID-19.

Children 6 months of age and older are eligible to receive Moderna or Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccines. Having two vaccines for this pediatric population provides a choice for parents who are eager to get their children vaccinated.

Hunter Health recommends every child who is eligible to get a vaccine, receive their vaccine as soon as possible.
