Important notice about Medicaid Unwinding

Kansas is reviewing Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) eligibility for some patients. If a patient is disenrolled from these programs, they may still qualify for financial assistance to buy a health plan through the Health Insurance Marketplace. Patients should make sure their contact information is up to date with the state and check their mail for a letter about their Medicaid or CHIP coverage. The letter will let them know if they need to fill out a renewal form to see if they still qualify. If they don't, they can find affordable and comprehensive Marketplace plans at HealthCare.gov by providing current information about their household and income.
