for our patients. That's why we are excited to offer financial counseling services to help patients better understand their balances and financial options. Rocio Rivera, our Patient Service Revenue Associate, is available on-site every Tuesday and Wednesday to provide personalized assistance for patients in need.

Some patients may not be aware of programs like the Sliding Fee Scale, which offers a discount fee program

to all income-eligible uninsured and underinsured patients. Rocio helps patients learn about these programs and assists them in providing the necessary documentation to qualify. She also offers payment plan options for those who need it, which can extend up to 12 months.

Rocio also helps educate patients about their insurance coverage, such as deductibles and co-payments.

"Our goal is to empower patients with knowledge about their insurance, deductibles, and co-payments, so they can make informed decisions about their healthcare," she says.


Having learned about Hunter Health through college connections, Paige shared, involvement and development.
